OUR OLD HOUSE IS OLDER THAN WE THOUGHT

We are indebted to Vina Bailey of Coldwater Lake, who called us last week and corrected our ideas of just how old our old house is, here on the Messenger and Lake of the Hills plot.

Vina said our house was built around 1900, by Allie Shepard's father, Lawrence Shepard, so far as the front part was concern-

Lawrence Shepard was Weidman's first undertaker.

About 1910, David Flower, a brother-in-law of Allie Shepard, moved into the house and built on the dining room and

(Only at that time it was a kitchen and woodshed. The Roes made the woodshed into a kitchen and the kitchen into a dining room. They also built on a leanto addition for a bathroon, in the 1930s.)

When Rolla and Minnie Roe bought the place, in 1914, as we remember, there was no foundation under the house. Neil Faling, the town's carpenter, put jacks under the cumbersome two-ell building and built a ce-

Gradually, over the years, the porch was added, hardwood floors and woodwork installed, but we still went on putting on one layer of wallpaper after another.


ment and stone foundation.

Today, what with the cost of wallpaper and labor (which isn't what it used to be back in the days when Jessie Rosencrantz did our papering), Connie said, "No more wallpaper. We cover up the horrors with wood paneling, and that's it."

So that's what we're doing, one room at at time. (We don't have the kind of money that would allow us to sweep through the house, presto chango, all at once.)

Anyhow, we've made a start at it, and there it is, for better or worse. We think it's very much for the better.

The Earl Geaslers operated Miles Drallette's fox farm on the hills beyond the lovely home of Mrs. Vera (Tvorik) Campbell and her husband.

Joe was a friend of Solomon Jackson, who lived in the "Indian house" north of the Harry Herman home. The two came to town Saturday nights, and Barney and Frances Tranbarger tell of the time when they ran a restaurant in the old Fisher Building (since torn down), and the two friends would come in and order huge plates of food.

Sometimes they would say, "I will pay you in two weeks from today, when my pension check comes," and Barney says they both always came in on the day they said they would, and paid their bills.

"I dunno," Solomon Jackson

said, shrugging. "He Ottawa, me Chippewa. I don't know what he said."

As near as Barney and Frances could figure, the two Indians were just plain homesick for their native tongues, so each talked a torrent of words at the other, each in his own language, just to hear it spoken.

Joe Akenbell and his Indian friend, John Johnson, died when Joe's cabin on Walker Creek was burned to the ground one winter: night. Solomon Jackson in late life went to live with a daughter near Rosebush, and died a natural death. They were the last of the old-time lovable secondgeneration Indians of this area.
