27, 1970:



VANCE WOOD DRAFTED AS SUPERVISOR CANDIDATE

Vance Wood will be a write-in candidate for Sherman Township Supervisor in the Aug. 4 primary elections, in response to a draft call of Sherman Township voters

He will oppose Earl Oplinger on the Republican ticket.

Vance Wood is listed on the printed ballot as a candidate for re-election as Township Trustee, and his candidacy for Supervisor now will necessitate voters' writing in his name in the Supervisor space on the ballot and ignoring his printed name on the ballot as candidate for Trustee.

This will not be as complicated as appears at first glance, it was stated Monday, as the voter will have only to do the write-in in the blank space provided for such contingencies, under the heading of "Supervisor," and leaving the printed name without marking the ballot.

A voting machine has been installed in the Sherman Township Hall, and residents of the township will have a chance to become acquainted with it before election day.

Also on the Republican ticket will be listed Keith Loomis, for re-election as Township Clerk; Alma Dosenberry as Township Treasurer; and Constables, Don Smith, Thayne Sides and Howard Beutler.

Earl Oplinger now is an elected Trustee of Sherman Township, with two years more until his term expires.

Mrs. Carol Schafer has filed for nomination for Township Treasurer on the Democratic ticket.

Next week, from July 27 to July 31, there will be a member of the Township Board at the Sherman Town Hall each weekday evening from 6 to 10 p.m., to help the public get acquainted with the new voting machine. Sherman Township voters are strongly urged to go out there and learn to use the new machine correctly.
