Several local people have been enjoying a nine-day tour of Spain, during last week and this.



Apparently the gas overflowed and spilled, caught fire, and the car was a total loss.

Her father went out, after calling State Police at Mt. Pleasant, and, with their permit took the deer home and dressed it out. State Police came over at 10.30 Friday morning and gave her an official permit to keep the doe.

GERALD ROBERTS HAS
FASCINATING PLAT BOOK

We are indebted to Gerald Roberts of the Brinton area for a look at a fascinating old platbook, very lage, bound in hard covers and dated 1899.

Isabella County at that time was being settled by families following the timber men who cut down trees and left stumps and brush--but the families took up land at around a dollar an acre, usually, which the lumber men usually had bought from the

State of Michigan for around 50 cents an acre.

Some townships show, in 1899, large operations still going on in this area, or at least large holdings by big timber men.

In Gilmore Township, Whitney & Remick show holdings of land, along with Rust Bros. & Co., Edmund Hall, and J.S. Weidman.

In Coldwater Township, J. H. Clark held a piece consisting of 662.73 acres in Section 3. Also showing, among many others, is the St. Mary's Woolen Mfg. Co. Whitney & Remick still had some land holdings in Coldwater in 1899, along with Gebhart. O. T. Brinton held 160 acres, plus a large piece of the village of Brinton.

In Sherman Township, timber operators showing included C. K. Eddy & Co., J.S. Weidman, A. Gebhart, and H.C. Woodworth. Bert Amy owned a forty, as did F. Losey, H. Beutler who also held 105 acres and Eliza Beutler held 80. J. Beutler had a forty. Fred Terry had 80 acres, Millard Pennington 135, E.M. Halstead 40, John Hein 120. In Broomfield Edmund Hall ap-

In Broomfield Edmund Hall apparently was still going strong (he had a sawmill at Bundy Hill) and he shows ownership of most of Sections 5,6,7,8, 18, 20 and 29.

H.D. Wright owned a forty and an eighty; H.L. Cummins had a forty; J.S. Weidman held 236.59 acres plus a tract of 77.81 acres; M.D. Swan had 200 acres, Theodore Hummel 120, C. Krueger 40, E. Rhode 40, E. Hine 40, A. Hine 40, Wm. Lueder 80;

H.L. Lueder owned an eighty, M. Riker a forty, Wm. Loomis 40, J.A. Wolfe 40, E. Benn 40.97, and Wm. Broomfield 201.24. These all, of course, are only spot-listing of many names on ownership plats.

In Rolland Township Whitney & Remick held great acreages. Towns listed in the county included Brinton, Weidman, Beal City, Delwin, Mt. Pleasant, Isabella City, South Mt. Pleasant, Longwood, Millbrook, Shepherd, Winn, and Blanchard. Sherman City of course was platted as a town, and was going strong at that time.

Railroad stops listed included Rosebush Station, Jordan Station, Isabella Station, Bundy Station, Mansfield Station, Foster Station, Burnham Station, Loomis Station, Vernon City, Wise Station, Delwin, and Leaton. Remick Station is also listed as a rail stop.

Post offices showed at Gilmore, Russell Post Office, Herrick Post Office, Calkinsville, Whiteville, Beal City, Vandecar, Drew, Horr, Caldwell, Boyden Post Office, Coomer, Alember Post Office, and Mt. Pleasant;

Also Rowland Post Office, Strickland Post Office, Jerseyville, Crawford, Summerton, and Coe.

These are only a very few of

the many listings of people and places in that 1899 plat book. Gerald thinks probably his grandfather, Hanford Roberts, bought the book on its publication.


