
I just hope and pray that the three men now on the Board will stick in there until the people have a chance to do their job at the next Board election.

BIG STORM DASHES HOPES FOR EARLY SPRING HERE

Described by many as the worst storm of the winter, a sudden and unpredicted onslaught of driving snow slammed into the Weidman area early Monday mor-

With temperatures in the high twenties most of the day, heavy snows were tossed about by gusty winds into drifts that blocked some roads and made others difficult for drivers.

Area schools made emergency closings at noon. Driving was a near-impossibility most of the day, as the soft snow piled up on windshield wipers and formed ice which nullified the wipers' functions.

The Weidman mail route made the east side of the territory but quit at the post office before attempting the west half.

Cancellations of meetings and events all over Central Michigan were announced on radio all day, with Oren's Stores in Mt. Pleasant closing at noon.

Drifting snow made roads a real problem for snowplows, which were working round the clock during and after the storm to get roads passable again.

One of the worst after-effects of the storm was walking conditions, with ice under the new snow making walking especially hazardous.
