ISABELLA CO. TAXPAYERS DID If we may borrow George Wallace's campaign slogan of "Send Them a Message", we'll point out that, in Monday's Chippewa

Hills School election, taxpayers in the high-valuation area of Isabella County did just that to the Board of Education.

In the "Weidman Precinct", i. e., the taxpayers of that portion of the school district lying in high-taxpaying Isabella County we turned out on a day of drizzling rain and elected John Berryhill to replace George Weichman of Mecosta as a Board member.

Weidman totaled 333 voters, with Berryhill taking 229. Trailing in voter participation, Remus came next with 257 voters getting out, giving Berryhill 88 votes. Barryton and Mecosta were 'way down in voter turnout, with Weichman winning in both precincts, one his home town.

Mecosta County land owners do not pay the excruciatingly high taxes for the school that Isabella County taxpayers do, hence, as we see it, the overwhelming vote in the Weidman Precinct for Berryhill and against irresponsible spending of real estate tax monies by the School Board.

In any case, the district now has a Board of Education weighted four to three in favor of sane planning and expenditure and against Supt. James P. Jorgensen (Paul), in particular.


Heretofore the Board has slavish ly followed Jorgensen's dictates. Jorgensen is hired for the forthcoming school year, 1972-73; but Monday night a Board member said that he had not as yet accepted the contract offered

him by the Board early this year. Isabella County voters in the Chippewa Hills School District sent the Board of Education a clear message: Use our wrung-out tax money wisely--or else.

In Monday's election, Weidman swung the vote for the entire district. Thus taxpayers can control political spending if they will.

Might we also point out that it is in the "Weidman Precinct" that the Weidman Messenger has a high circulation of paid subscribers?

BERRYHILL WINS BOARD SEAT IN MONDAY ELECTION

John Berryhill of rural Remus won easily in Monday's school election for a seat on the Board of Education for the Chippewa Hills School District. He was opposing incumbent George Weichman of Mecosta.

The election was won by voters in the Weidman area. Following are the unofficial figures as given out by the school's office Monday night after the polls closed:

Weidman, Berryhill 229, Mrs. Hartzler 52, Weichman 29, Lacey 23, with eight ballots spoil-

Remus, Berryhill 88, Hartzler 77, Weichman 50, Lacey 22.

Barryton, Weichman 69, Hartzler 51, Berryhill 40, Lacey 9, with one ballot spoiled. Mecosta, Weichman 70, Hartzler 39, Berryhill 35, Lacey 28, with 11 ballots spoiled.

There was one write-in ballot in Remus for Edna Hatfield. District-wide the totals were:

Berryhill 392, Hartzler 219, Weichman 218, Lacey 82. Twenty-nine ballots were spoiled in the district. A total

of 941 votes was cast. Polls closed at 8 p.m.


