STATE CONTROL TAKES US FARTHER FROM LOCAL UNDERSTANDING AND VOTES

On Monday, June 12, school election day, we had numerous telephone calls inquiring about the three mills for vocational education many thought this district was involved in.

That week the Mt. Pleasant paper ran articles "explaining" the proposition for building a vocational education plant in the Isabella-Gratiot Intermediate School District, and spoke of the "Isabella people voting on the

Many in the Chippewa Hills School District became thoroughly confused, and with reason, as to whether the three-mill tax proposition would be on the bal-Iot in the Chippewa Hills Dis-

Part of Isabella County is in the Chippewa Hills School District, and therefore lies within the Mecosta-Osceola-Montcalm-Etcetera Intermediate School District (whatever an "Intermediate District" is).

We in the Chippewa Hills District voted the millage proposition down with a bang, earlier this year, and are not called on to vote on it again -- yet.

This is an illustration of the big-big school district blurred into a bigger-bigger "intermediate" district and nobody knows where it begins or leaves off.

The "Intermediate" school districts are brainchildren of the Michigan Education Department at Lansing, as is the propaganda for building new additional vocational educational schools.

Anybody with any gumption at all can get anything he or she wants in vocational education at Mt. Pleasant, Big Rapids, or Harrison. The state, naturally, wants more money to play around with and perpetuate itself in high paying offices.

This is state control of the schools. It is coming closer to home every day.




