PANIC SPREADING AMONG HOME OWNERS

It is no exaggeration to say that there is panic spreading like wildfire among home owners and other land owners in Isabella County.

Last week we all received notices from the office of Robert Grinzinger, "equalization director" for Isabella County on tax matters, but containing "True Cash Value" prices set on our homes and lands by a Detroit outfit named GEM Survey Company.

We recall our spine-tingling response to the robot-like polite unresponsive unyielding young man who came to our door last summer with a letter of introduction signed by Maynard Gilmore, County Clerk.

The following week we printed an editorial blast on the robotlike young man's invasion of our home and privacy.

Last week we received the "GEM Survey Company's" valuation of our home and lake lots.

We were certain there must have been some mistake, for straggly little Connie Skinner was listed as holding a fortune amounting to \$67,800 in taxable property.

Our impulse is the same as that of many who have come to our office or called on the phone.

Dump it.

Is this what the Isabella County Board of Commissioners wants? If we all start dumping our property at any price, real estate in Isabella County will be dead.

Is this what all this finagling by the Board of County Commissioners is about? (They hired the "GEM Survey Company" of Detroit to come up here and tell us what we are worth for the sake of taxation purposes by the County.)

Is the County out to ruin itself? It will, if real panic develops among landholders here. And that there is panic among land owners, there is no doubt.

This is "equalization?" ****


We can't depend on someone else. We have all got to do our utmost NOW, or things will get progressively worse.
