Ain't that wunnerful? Yeah. ****


SHUCKS, HERE WE GO AGAÍN

Word came to the Messenger office late Monday afternoon of a special lame-duck meeting called by the outgoing Board of Education of the Chippewa Hills School District last Tuesday

At this meeting it was voted unanimously to give Supt. Jorgensen an assistant, whose salary traditionally is about a thousand dollars less then the Superintendent's: or probably around \$18,000 a year, as Jorgensen gets \$19,000.00 per year in salary plus fringe benefits.

Also at that meeting it was voted unanimously to do away with principals at the Weidman and Mecosta schools and hire a "grade school co-ordinator" at \$15,000 a year plus travel expenses. (These new jobs all re-
