
NEW PLUMBER FOR WEIDMAN Weidman Village now has the services of a local plumber, William Brown, who lives on the southwest edge of town.




The Coldwater MOMS Club, a project of Eight-Cap, a federally-funded bureau, held a successful bake sale Saturday morning in Weidman.
