





When I was a little girl, more than 50 years ago, Christmas was very different than it is now.

But in my memory, it was bet-

About a week before Christmas, Wilbur, Minnie and I would strike out right after breakfast to pick out the tree. It was always a very fred Higgins, of Chicago, was special tree.

We girls watched, wide-eyed, while Web chopped it down. Then we all grabbed hold of the trunk and dragged it home.

We got pine tar on our mittens, and Mom had to use kerosene to get it out.

We set the tree up in a tall pail of water, weighted with stones, and there it sat till supper was over and the dishes and chores done.

We made paper chains with strips of construction paper, and stuck together with flour and

water paste. We popped corn and strung it on long, long threads, strung cranberries and thornapples, and draped them on the tree. We drew, colored, and cut out Santas, snowmen, bells, camels, and reindeer, and tied them on and thought it was a sight to behold.

We took pine boughs and put them behind the pictures and mirrors on the walls, so the whole house smelled of pine.

The day before Christmas, we cooked and baked all day. We took pickles out of the barrels of brine and cooked them in syrup and spices.

We had an early supper, then made peanut butter fudge, chocolate fudge, and taffy; popped corn, brought up a dishpan full of apples from the cellar, crisp and juicy, and had hot cider.

Did you ever eat apples and popcorn at the same time?

Christmas Eve was the real Christmas, to us. Christmas morning the girls each got a rag doll Mom had made. The boys got a bag of marbles and a homemade whistle.

We always had a house full of company, so I always had to wait, at the table, eat.

Christmas to me was pickedover chicken and cold potatoes.

We'd clean up the kitchen and Christmas was over; except that I had a doll to sleep with.

Every Christmas was the same, and I never got over the wonder of it.

When I was 12, I was too old for a doll, so I got a toothbrush. I sure missed the doll, but was so proud to have a toothbrush of my 'own. Up to then, we had just

used the family toothbrush for all of us.

I want one more Christmas Eve like the ones I used to have, so I'm staying right here and trying to relive the Christmas Eve of 1920. The popcorn won't be the big, fluffy kernels of old, but I'll pretend they are. ---0---


