The Church of the Nazarene had a Christmas program, fea-


tured by a play for which young people have been rehearsing since October.

Zapata, Texas Dec. 4, 2978

Dear Connie:

Just a line to let you know we are receiving the Messenger every week o.k. and are enjoying it.


