
We waded through a few hundred of 'em and grew sick of it, and wanted off that mailing list.

Here's a new address: PFC. Steven Faber, US5499-2344, Ktrp. 3/11, ACR, APO San Francisco 96257.

Steve landed at Ben Ho, Vietnam, and was sent on to Black Horse Base Camp, about 30 miles from Saigon. He wrote his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter Faber, that Glen Bierschbach was in the same camp.

Steven is with the 11th Armored Cavalry, a tank division. He wrote that the Vietcong go into the American camp regularly, and that 25 to 30 Vietcong were killed in a "fire fight" a couple of days before he wrote his letter home.

He said the village of Ben Ho is about the size of Clare, and only rich people have floors in their homes, and that all houses are hooked together, with no windows. He said the good homes there compare with our worst slum units in this country. There are only three or four privately-owned cars in the town, he said.

He wrote that all the men he trained with at Fort Knox are with him at Black Horse Base Camp. About 50 helicopters are there at all times, he said. Steven saw a good bit of this country on his trip to Vietnam, going by way of Alaska. He arrived there to 95 degree heat and humidity. He said rain began the day he got there, and it has rained every day since.
