### OIL ROUNDUP

Brazos Oil Company reported their State No. 1, on the Ted Nutt farm, at around 2700 feet Tuesday, expecting to encounter Traverse at about 3100.

At Leonard Company's Grewett and Cliff Estate No. 1 at the edge of Weidman, rotary was removed and the well waiting on standard rig, expected this week.

At the Margaret Wieber well in Nottawa, "Shorty" Merrill reported depth Tuesday at 3575, having encountered Traverse at 3188 with no showing. Dundee was expected to be reached on Thursday today.

"We have a chance," Shorty said. "It's higher by 20 feet than the Vogel well."

This is the seventh or eighth try for an extension to the Isabella field, Mr. Merrill said. This is the first one that looks like anything, as he put it.

The Isabella field is commonly called the Rosebush field hereabouts.
