

NOW WE ADMIT WE HAVE ASIAN FLU

Three or four weeks ago our Brinton news writer, Mrs. Sis-co, had an item beginning, "We have the new flu around here," and naming half a dozen victims.

This weekend we see by the Free Press that Isabella County is one of several officially listed as having definite Asian flu cases.

The disease has been creeping closer to Weidman and its surrounding area. Several cases of a vicious-type flu--but not officially acknowledged as the Asian type--have been reported here, with some patients experiencing the after-effects characteristic of the Asian type.

Dr. R. H. Strange had a limited supply of vaccine recently, and all the Messenger staff scrambled over and got the vaccination-shot of serum. Takes ten days, we hear, for the serum to take effect.

Tuesday morning the Davis Clinic in Mt. Pleasant reported a supply of vaccine available to the public. Other doctors presumably now have it, in some degree of supply.

The Asian flu is trickier than the usual kind, local people have been finding. Its after-effects may be severe and of longer duration.

On the other hand, several kinds of flu besides the Asian type seem to be making the rounds hereabouts.

Weidman and Beal City Public Schools report a mounting absenteeism on account of flu cases among the students.

Tuesday the schools were not planning on closing as yet. The Harrison schools were closed this week on account of flu among students and teachers.

The Weidman School reported Tuesday that 99 students were absent Monday, 109 on Tuesday. Two teachers have been absent with flu, Mrs. McAlvey and Mrs. Marcyes. Mrs. Marcyes was ill with flu last week, returned to her work and suffered a relapse.
