THE STATE JOURNAL WRITES UP WEIDMAN

Sunday's Lansing State Journal had a beautiful half-page spread on the situation on our local mill pond in relation to Ernie Loomis' blocking off fishing on the west side of the pond.

The Journal's writeup was complete, very fair, and gave the Weidman mill pond a wonderful send-off so far as publicity was concerned.

The writer laid out the situation as it now stands, with Ernie's fence put up, it stated, "so that people would have to pay him to fish on the west side of the pond."

The article started out with, "Weidman's mill pond, a hot-spot for fishing as far back as anyone can remember. . . . We can't ask for better write-ups than that."

The spread carried a large picture of Ernie standing beside one of his "No Trespassing" signs, but it also carried a nice photo of the road signs the Weidman Business Association put up last year, "Village of Weidman--Good Fishing."

The writer was very thorough, going back to last August's "hot Sunday afternoon," as he put it, when a few local fishing enthusiasts gathered on the north road to clean out a few spots so's you could get a line in. Stumps had drifted in to shore, weeds were so high and matted, there was no place to fish.

So a group of fishermen, including Ye Ed and Frances Tranbarger, went to work one Sunday afternoon, yes, a hot one.

It got hotter, too. Ernie tore down there after we'd dragged out two or three stumps, and accused us of stealing things off his land. The State Journal recalled all that, and even the fact that Connie Roe urged him to arrest her and make a case of it.

Oh, well. As you can see by this week's Messenger, there are plenty of other places to fish--for free!--on the Weidman mill pond. The State Journal said Ernie Loomis was not getting rich off trying to force fishermen to pay for the privilege of fishing on his side of the pond. It said he made twenty-five cents in one week-end, and this from a poor guy from Alma who paid Ernie a quarter for the privilege of fishing.


